

1. OBJECTIVE

It is the intention for the eDumbe Municipality – Technical Services to have a panel of Registered Environmental Assessment Consultants (EAC) to render Environmental Management services as and when required by the Municipality for a period of 2022/2023 TO 2024/2025 FINANCIAL YEARS 36 Months. The Environmental Management services required will not be limited to this terms of reference.

2. PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

This report is aimed at providing Terms of Reference as a guideline within which interested Registered EAC are expected to base their proposals. Therefore, it is expected of prospective Registered EAC to demonstrate their approach to be adopted, this will consequently inform their methodology envisaged, project financial implications, timeframes, and deliverables.

3. BACKGROUND

There are many developments within the eDumbe area that requires professional assistance from the Registered EAC to ensure that the Municipality is able to comply with NEMA 107 OF 1998 policies and regulations. There were previously some projects within the municipality that we fined by the Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs for not undertaking an EIA process and was instructed to appoint an EAC to conduct a Section 24G process in rectifying the unlawful commencement of a listed activity.

It is therefore the aim of the Technical Services to acquire the services of a panel of Registered EAC for a period of 36 Months with the aim of providing their professional services as required.

4. SCOPE AND EXTENT OF WORK

The scope and extent of work will be different for each project. It will be communicated to the panel members at that particular point in time. The scope of work will include the following:

- 1) Basic Assessment – conduct all the relevant processes including engagement with the relevant competent authority, specialist studies, public participation, developing the Environmental Management Programme and obtaining the Environmental Authorization
- 2) Scoping and Environmental Impact Report – prepare scoping report which will include the plan study. Prepare the Environmental Impact Report which will include relevant specialist studies, public participation, developing the Environmental Management Programme and obtaining the Environmental Authorization
- 3) Water Use License Application – Conduct relevant specialist studies, fill in relevant application forms and submit to the relevant competent authority.
- 4) Environmental Management Programmes (EMPr) – it could be part of the EIA process or it could be responding to Section 28 of NEMA: Duty of care and remediation of the environment
- 5) Environmental Control Officer (ECO) services: conduct environmental audit as per the stipulations in the environmental authorisation and EMPr of a particular project and submit relevant reports to the LM and relevant competent authority.
- 6) Amendments in terms of Part 1 and Part 2 as per the 2014 EIA regulations as amended.
- 7) Section 30A of NEMA for projects that falls under emergency situations
- 8) EIA Enquiries/ screening/environmental surveys in order to verify if the proposed project requires EIA or not.

5. PREREQUISITES FOR ENTRY TO THE PANEL

- i) Registration with the Municipal data base;
- ii) Registration with provisional body (EAPASA).

6. WORK ALLOCATION

Work will be allocated in accordance with a quotation system. Whereby allocation will be assessed and assigned. Work will be allocated on a rotational basis.

7. PAYMENT PROCEDURE

Payment arrangements will be made on the basis of the completion of project milestones and will be outlined in the letter of appointment. Payment will be effective within 30 days of the completion of each milestone of the project.

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

The following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value equal to or above R30 000 and up to a Rand value of R50 million (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 million(all applicable taxes included).

1.2 The value of this bid is estimated to not exceed R50 million (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the 80/20 preference point system shall be applicable.

1.3 Preference points for this bid shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price; and
- (b) B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution.

1.3.1 The maximum points for this bid are allocated as follows:

1.4 Failure on the part of a bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System (SANAS) or a Registered Auditor approved by the

Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors (IRBA) or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act (CCA) together with the bid, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE status level of contribution are not claimed.

- 1.5. The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

2. DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 “**all applicable taxes**” includes value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies;
- 2.2 “**B-BBEE**” means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad -Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.3 “**B-BBEE status level of contributor**” means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.4 “**bid**” means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- 2.5 “**Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act**” means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- 2.6 “**comparative price**” means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 “**consortium or joint venture**” means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 “**contract**” means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- 2.9 “**EME**” means any enterprise with a annual total revenue of R5 million or less.

- 2.10 **“Firm price”** means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 **“functionality”** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 **“non-firm prices”** means all prices other than “firm” prices;
- 2.13 **“person”** includes a juristic person;
- 2.14 **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.15 **“sub-contract”** means the primary contractor’s assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.16 **“total revenue”** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on 9 February 2007;
- 2.17 **“trust”** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.18 **“trustee”** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the

- contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;
- 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

- 5.1 In terms of Regulation 5 (2) and 6 (2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 5.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA’s approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 5.3 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 5.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 5.5 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 5.6 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the
